## Definitions

**System:** Core visual language that describes grid system, color, typography and spacing.

**Component:** Key building blocks of the design system.

**Pattern:** Combinations of components that address common user objectives and flows (e.g. filtering).

**Layout:** Combinations of components and patterns that represent what is finally shown in the browser.

## Design tokens

Core elements of the design system are identified through tokens.

**Token:** The code identifier for a unique role or set of roles

**Value:** The actual value or contents assigned to a token

**Alias token:** The systematic usage(s) of a token

**Token set:** Identifier for the responsive behaviour of tokens into a single token

## Color

We make a distinction between color-palette and color usage.

- The palette is the collection of all available colors
- The usage indicates how those colors are used on text, backgrounds, and borders through alias tokens.

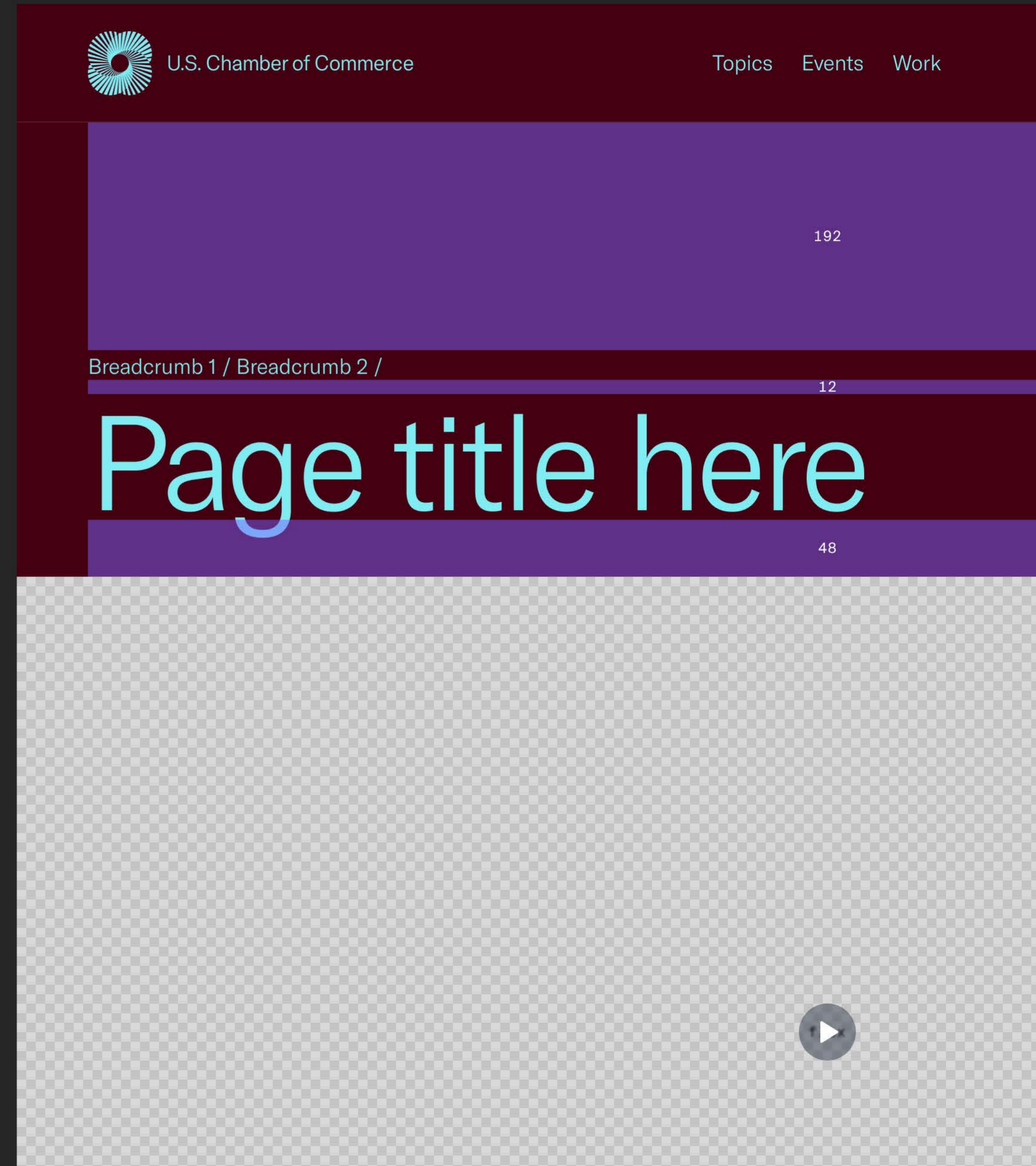

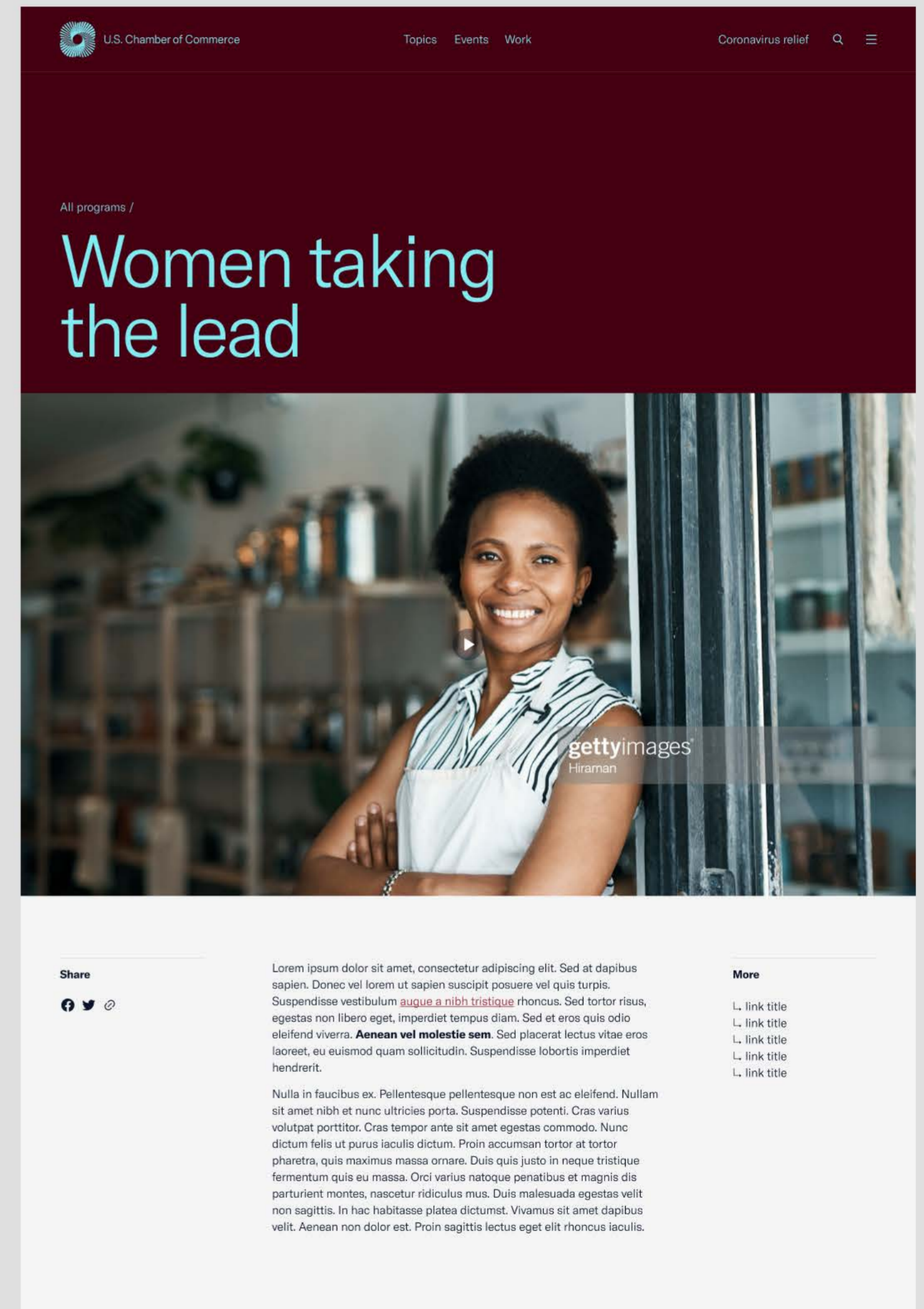
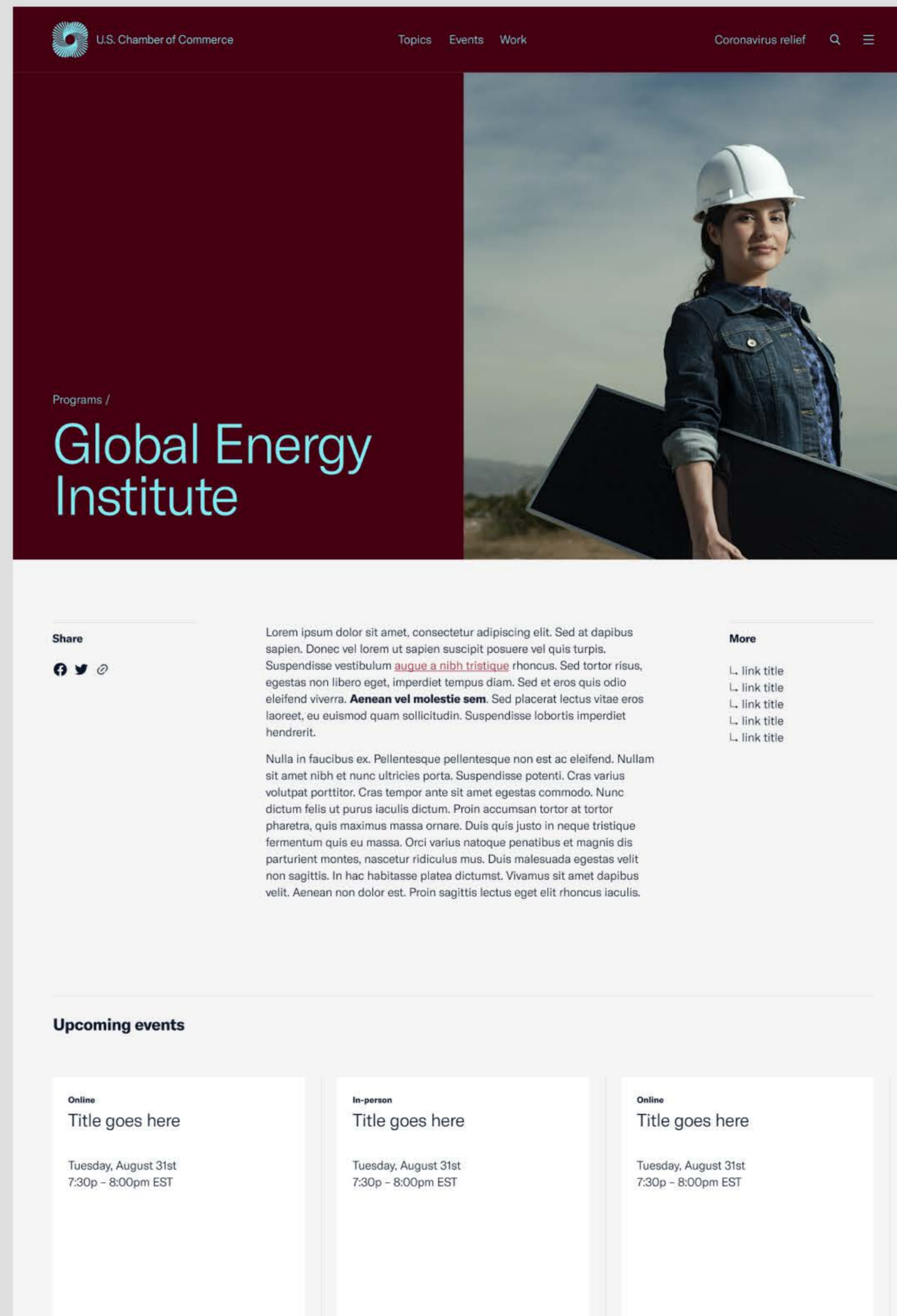

# Hero images

Hero images can have either landscape or portrait orientations. The portrait hero module (left) is the default template. The landscape variation (right) is an optional hero variation that supports a video.

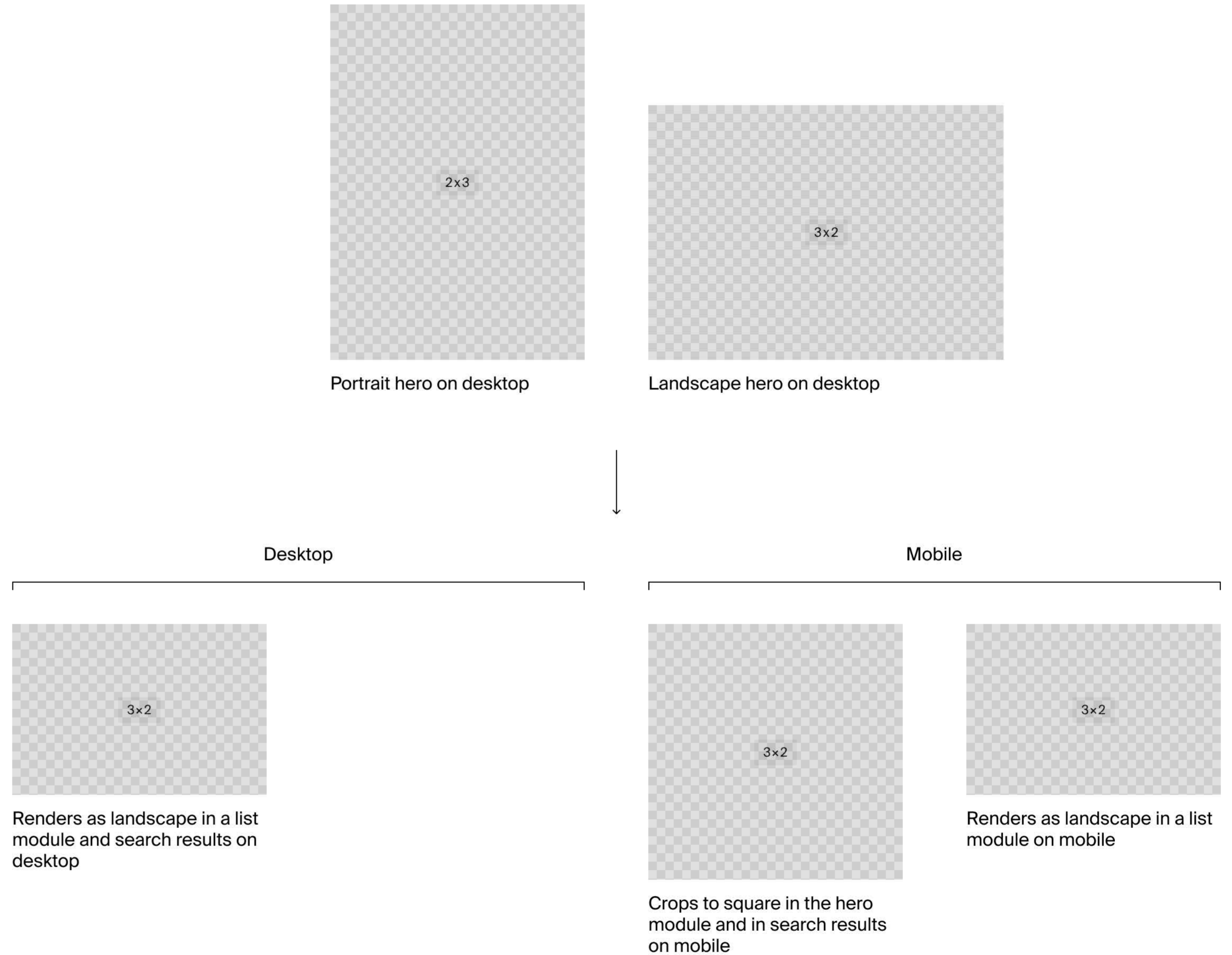
Use the landscape hero variation (either with an image or video) for more prominent programs or initiatives (i.e. the America Works Initiative).



## Hero image editing

Regardless of its orientation in the hero module on desktop, the same image would appear with a landscape ratio in other desktop contexts such as listing and search modules.

On mobile, hero images appear as a square in a hero module and in search results, and with a landscape ratio in a listing module. This is illustrated further in the following pages.



## Photography

### Editing a portrait hero

The image should be 1824 x 2736 px (2:3 ratio) at 72 dpi. Make sure the subject matter is near the center of your image because the image will crop on the top and bottom in the square ratio.

You may also start from a landscape image for this “portrait” module. It would be cropped as portrait in the CMS. The dimensions for the image are 2736 x 1824 (3:2 ratio) at 72 dpi. As above, make sure the subject is near the center as the image would crop on the left and right sides.

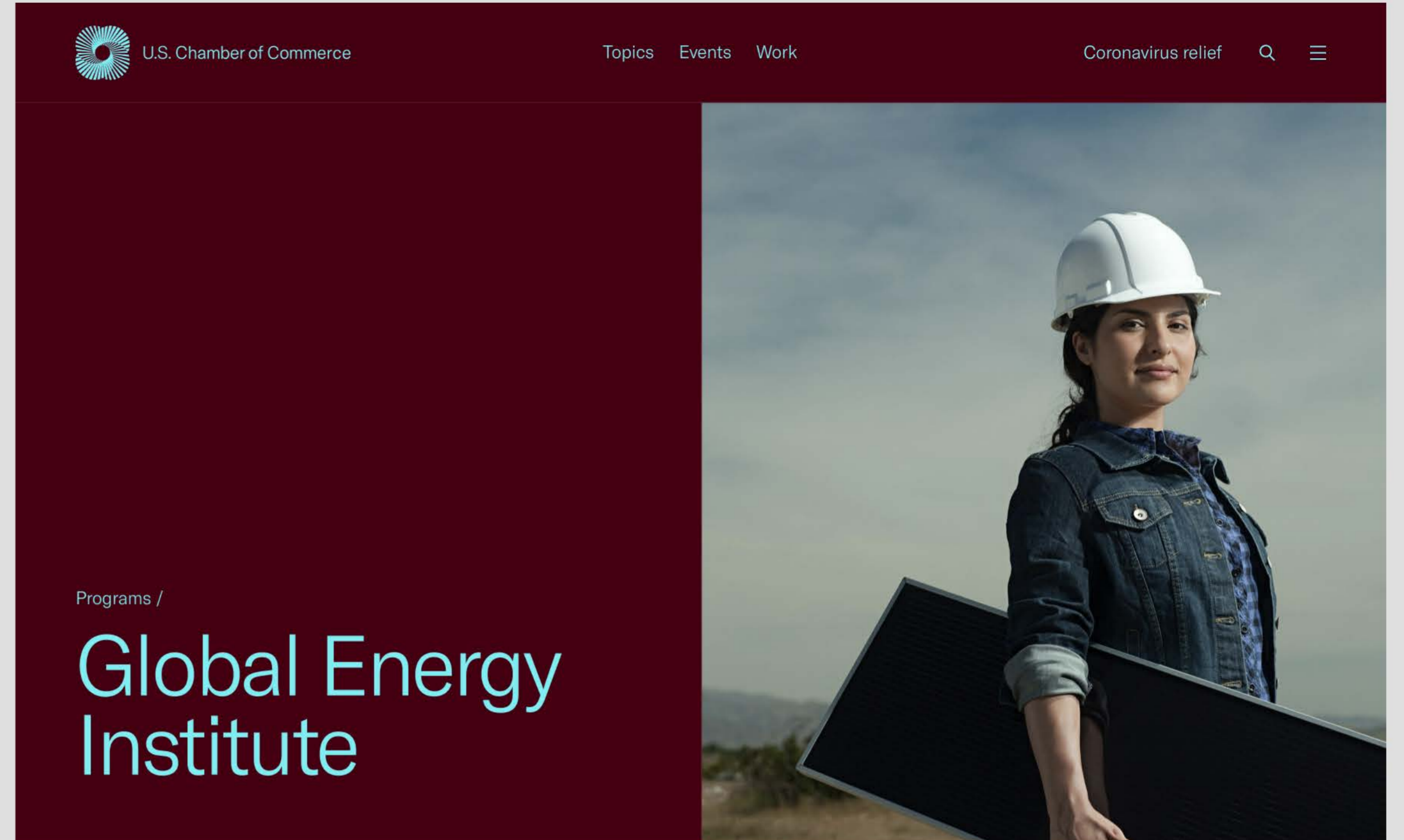

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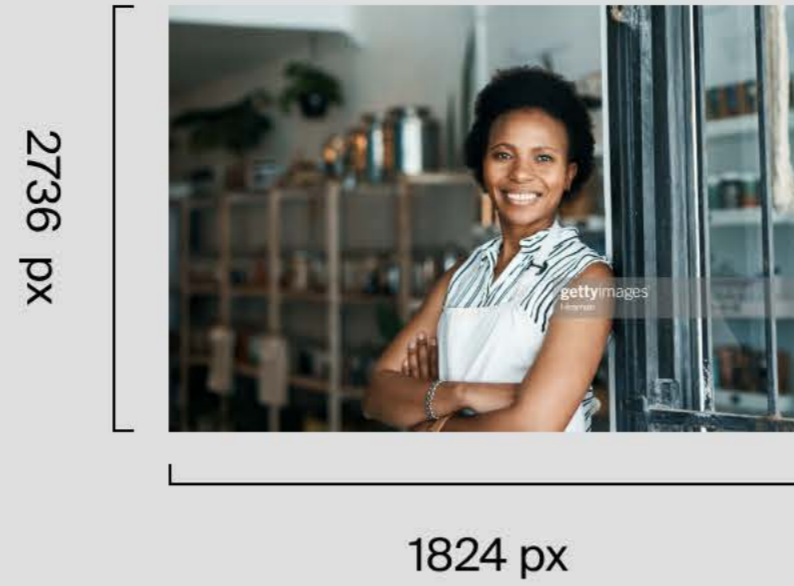
## Photography

### Editing a landscape hero

Use an image sized to 2736 x 1824 px (3:2 ratio) at 72 dpi.

Make sure the subject is near the center of your image, because your image will crop on the left and right sides.

Similar to the portrait hero, this image may also appear as a landscape image in other desktop contexts and as a square in mobile contexts.

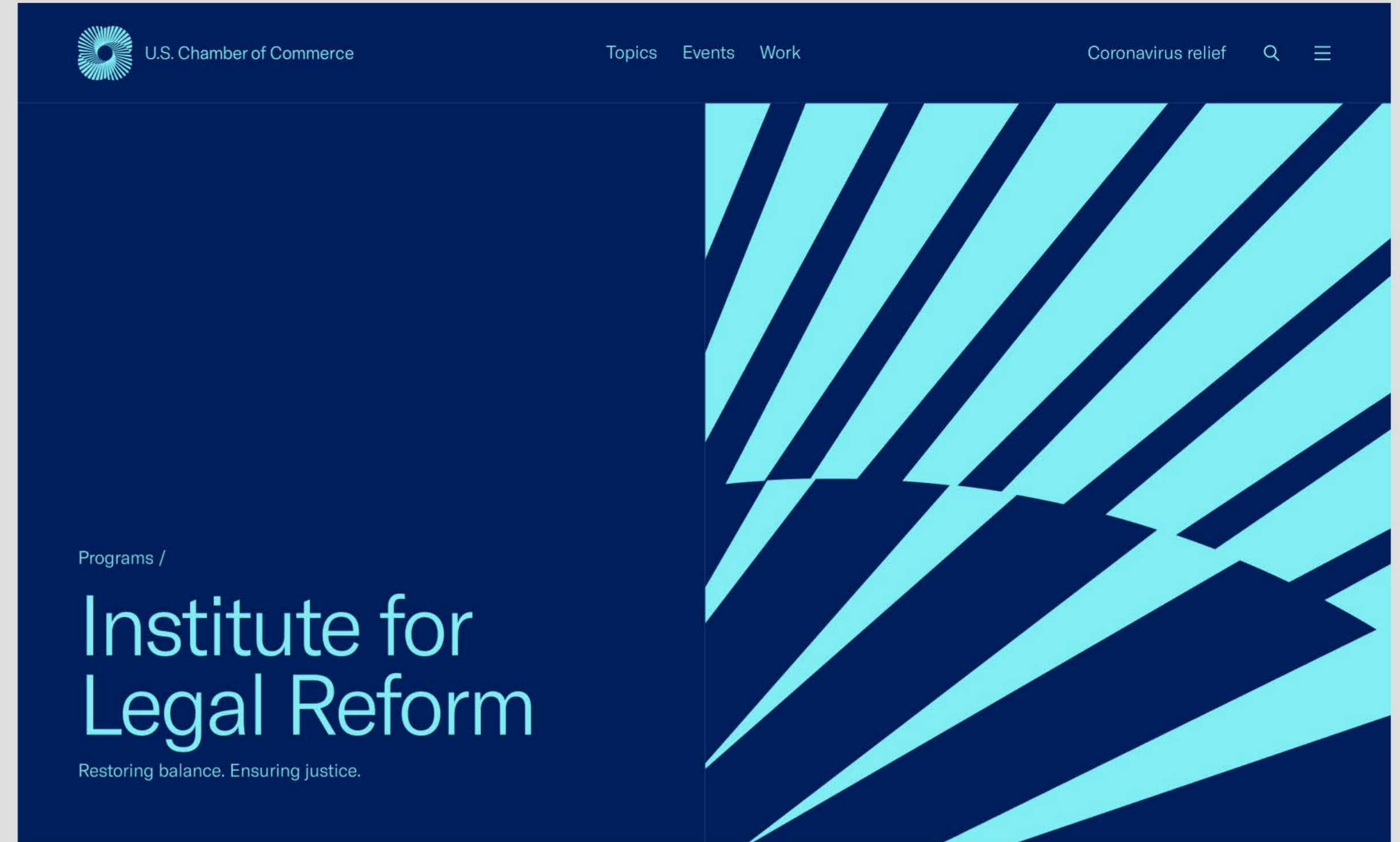
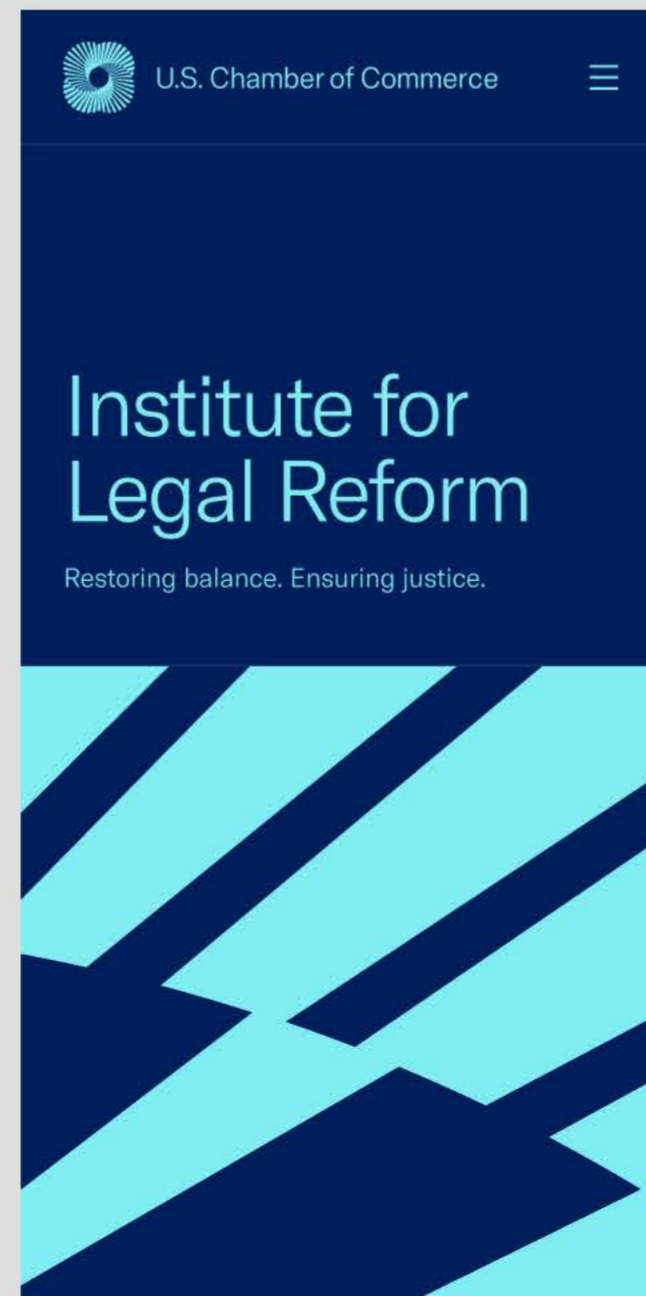

### Hero fallback option

If no image is uploaded, the CMS defaults to a crop of a graphic symbol. Do this with some frequency as the graphic language adds dynamism, impact and variety to the design system as a user navigates the site.

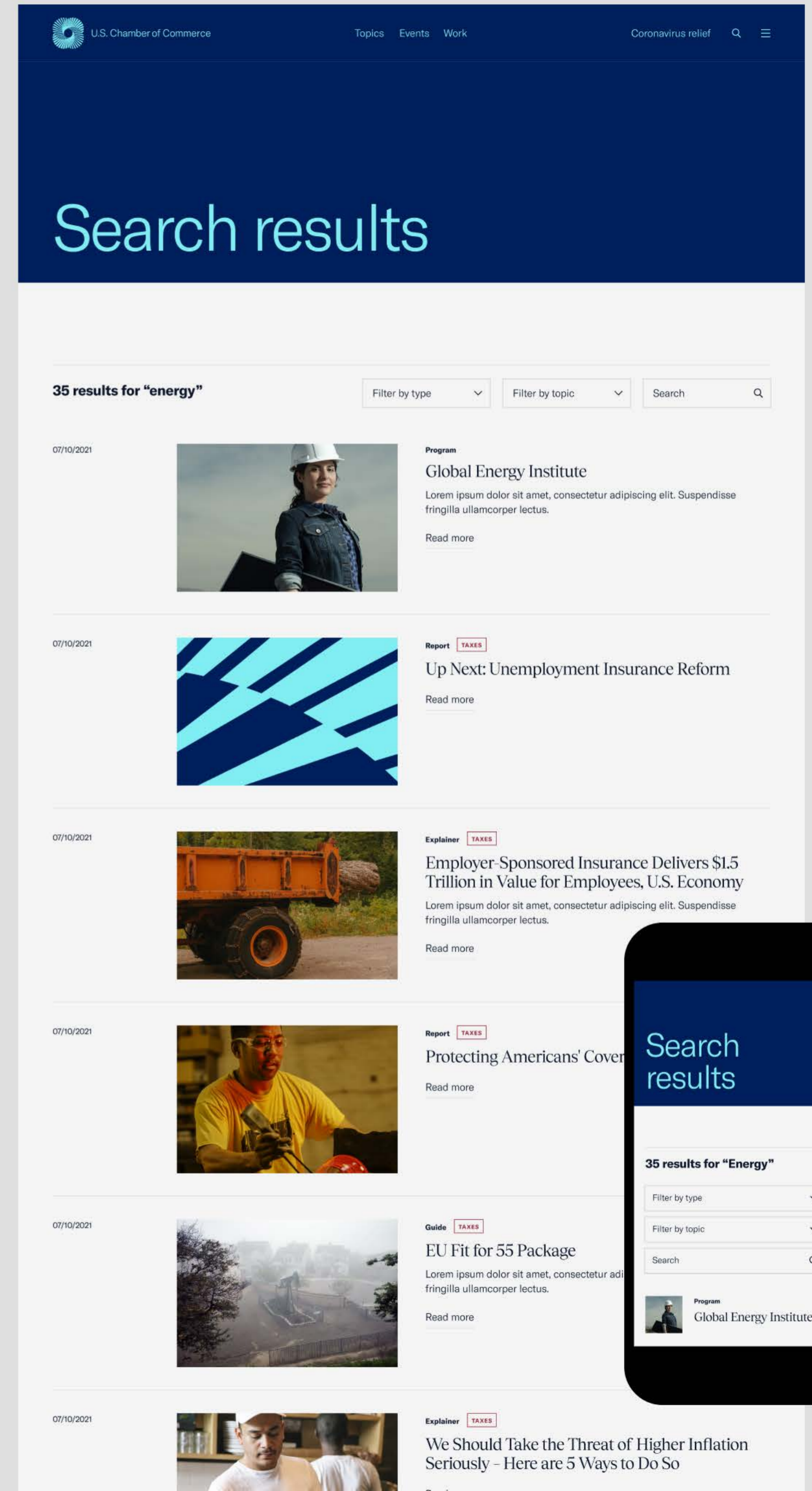
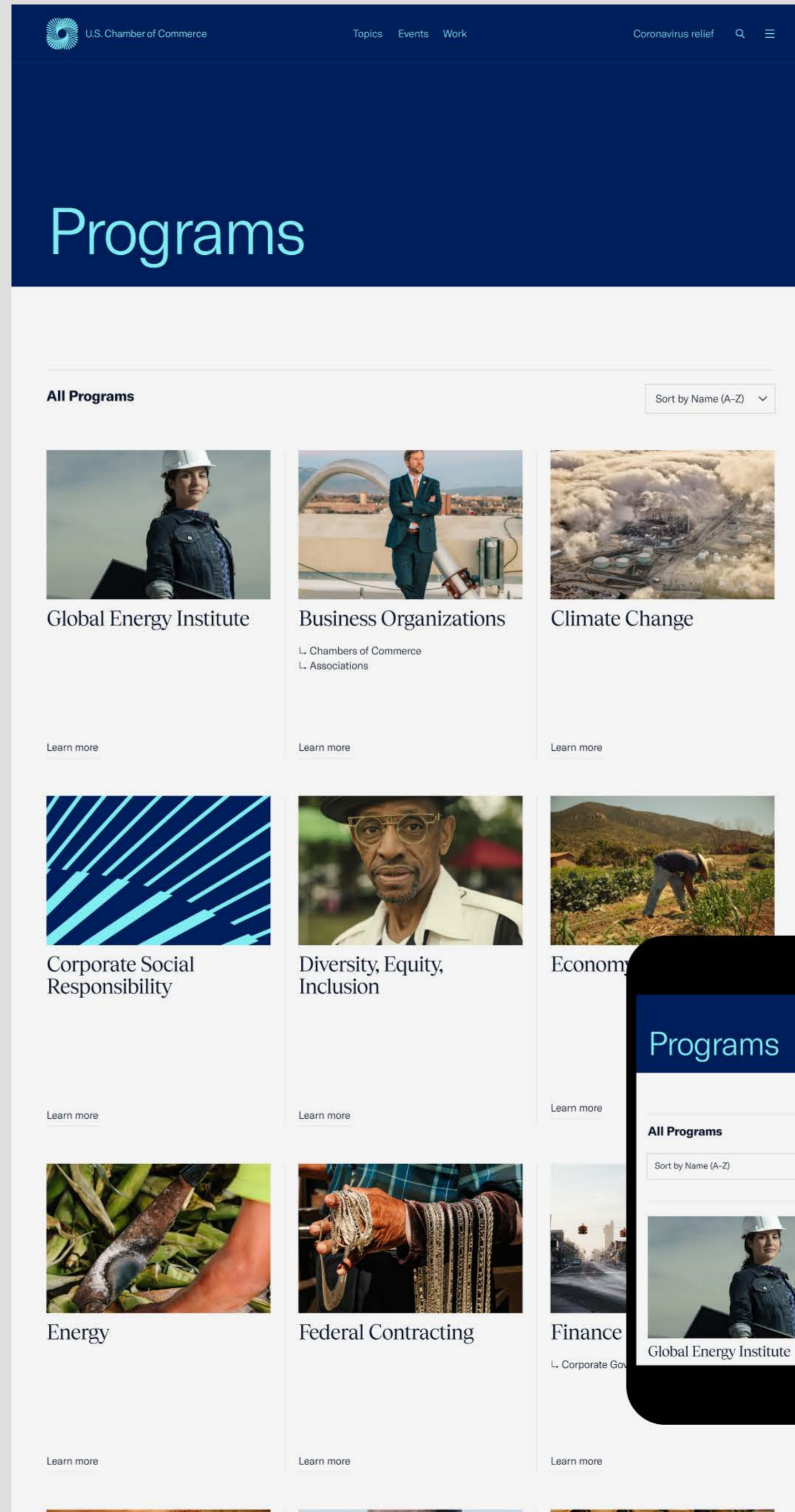
- Repairing our broken class action lawsuit system, such as the recent massive spike in securities class action litigation.

## How the hero cascades in the design system

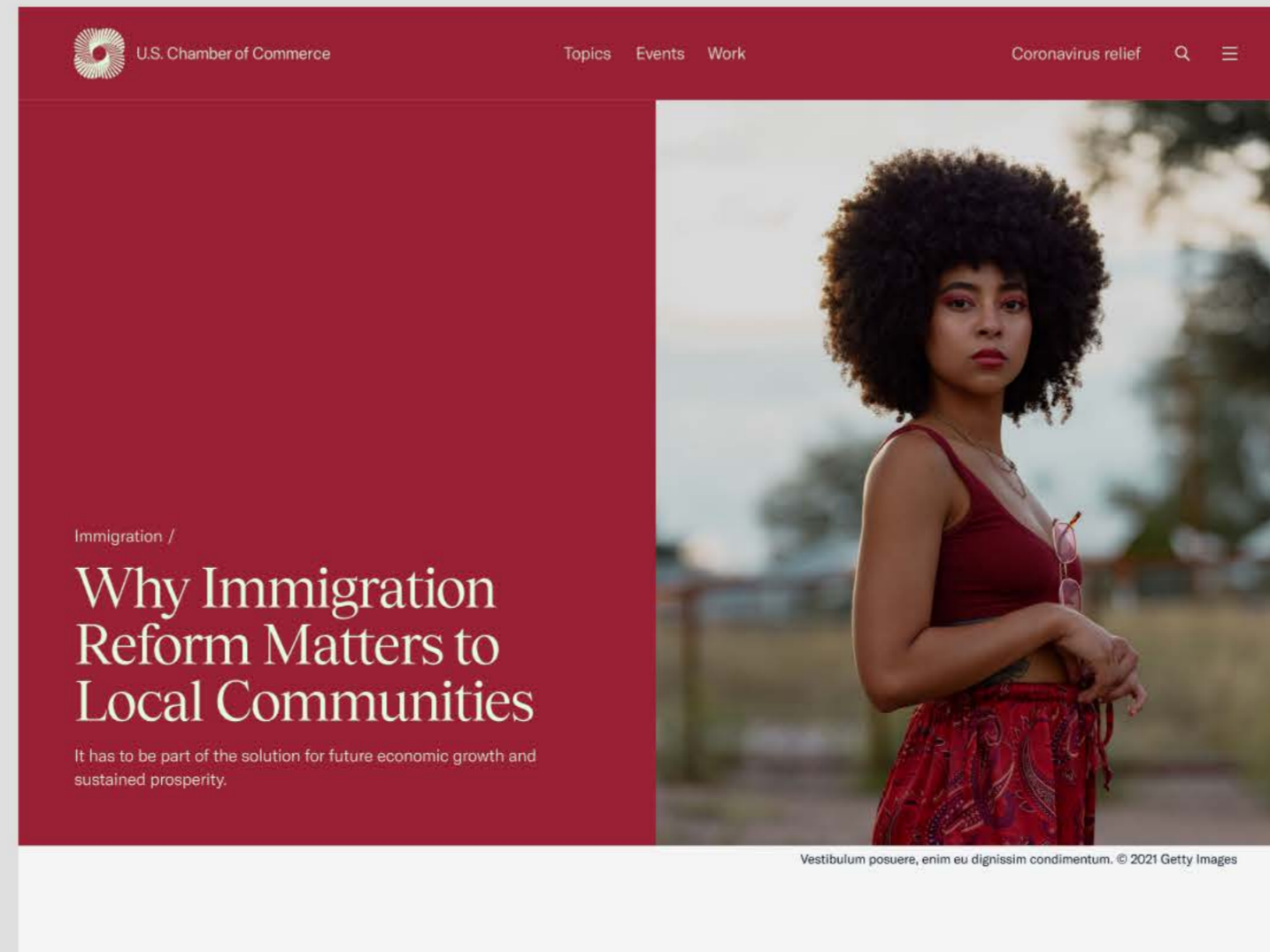
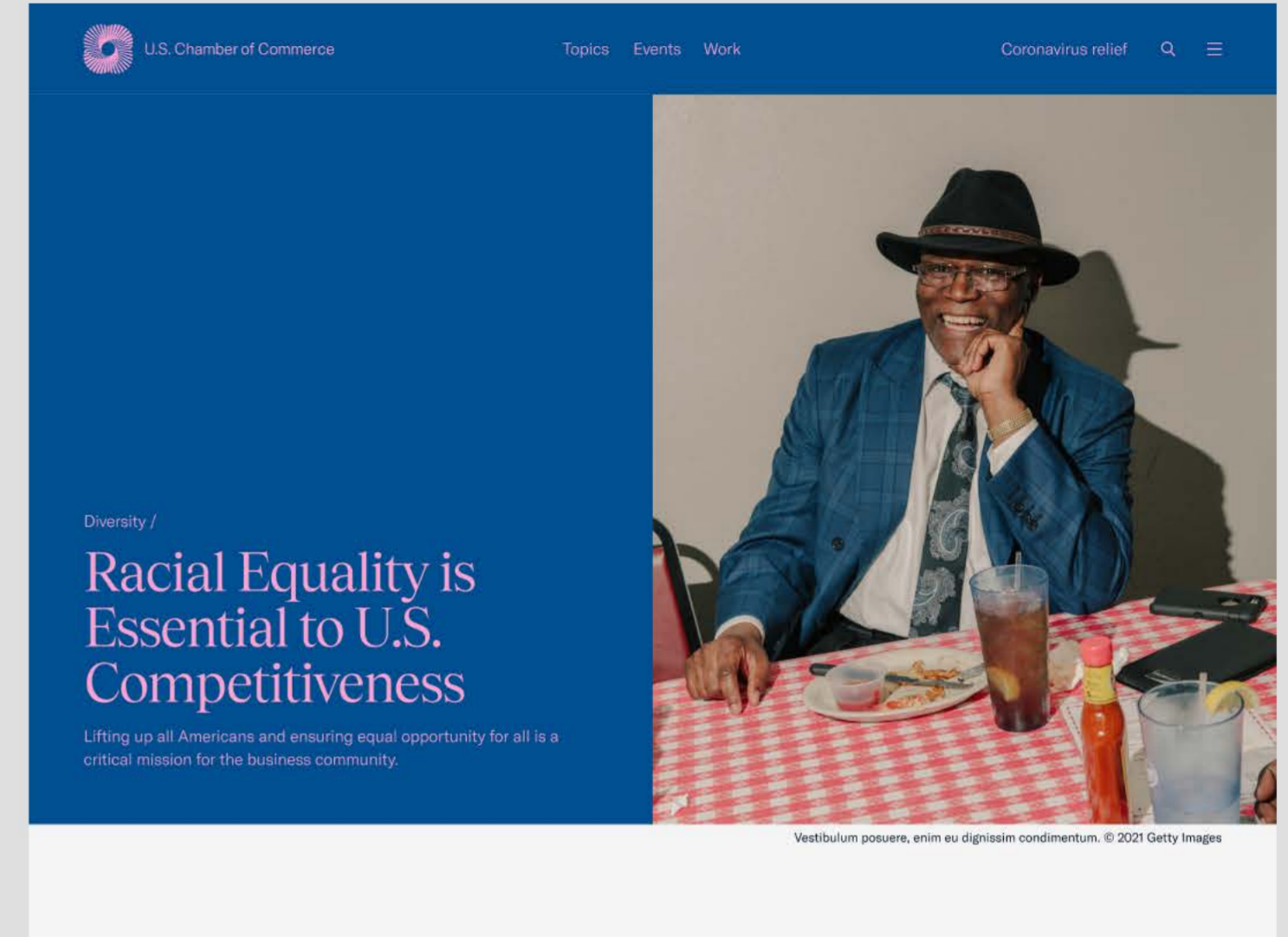
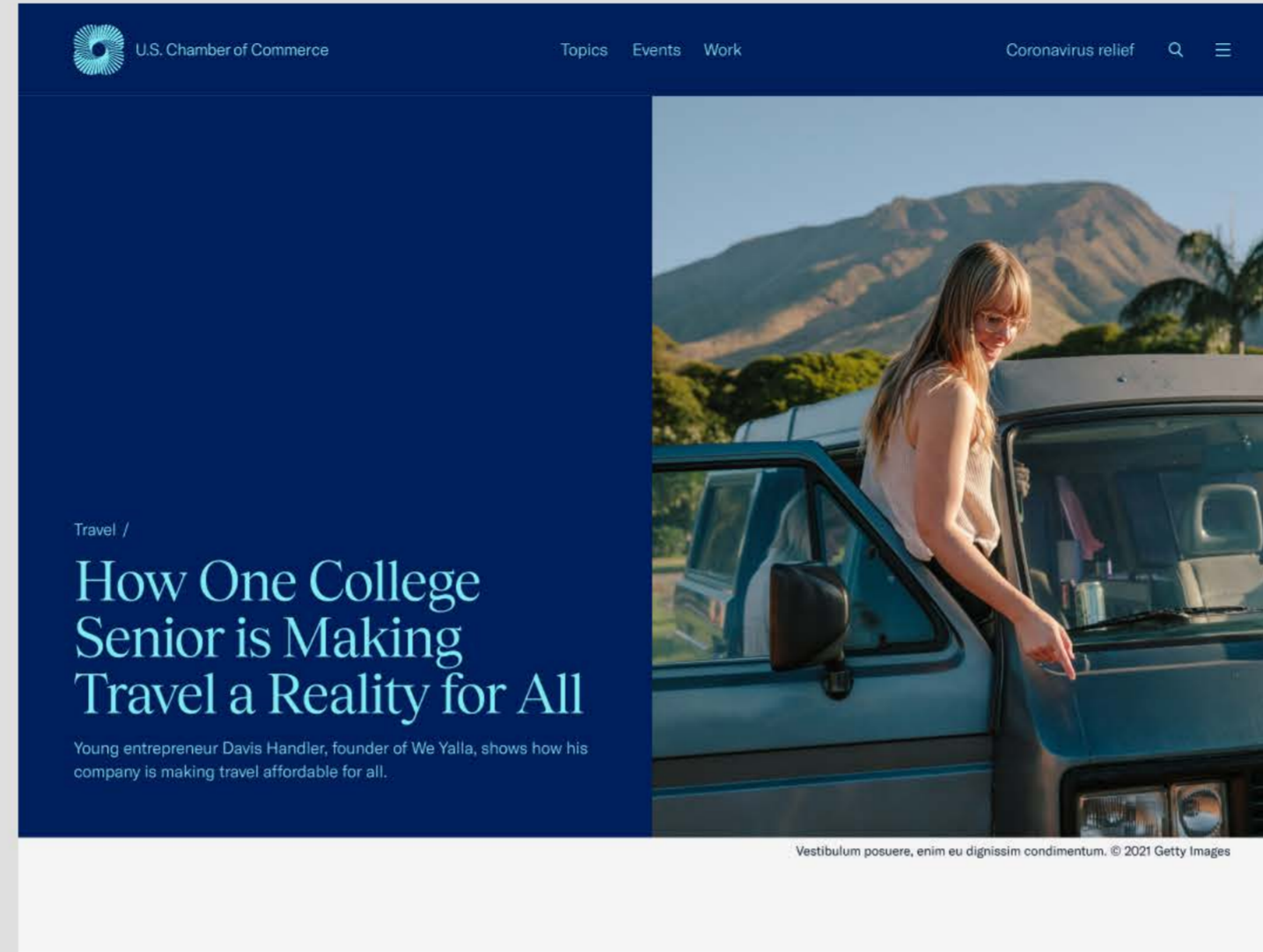
Regardless of its orientation in the hero module, the same image can appear with a landscape ratio in a grid listing module on both desktop and mobile. In search results, that same image would appear with a landscape ratio on desktop but with a square ratio on mobile.

Again, it's important for the subject to be near the center as the image will crop either on the top and bottom or the left and right sides.



## Color matching

If possible, attempt to match the color of the hero image and background. At a minimum, avoid colors that appear to clash with one another.



## Color correction

Look for images that have a “silver tone,” with darker highlights and, although still rich in hue, are somewhat desaturated.

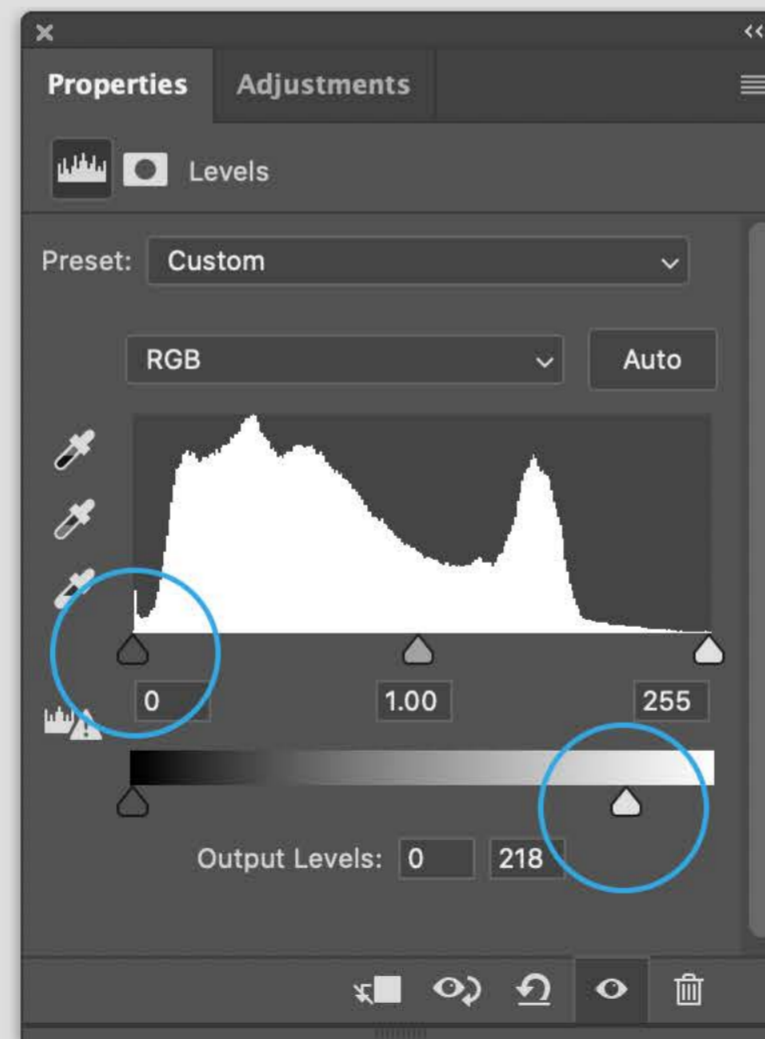

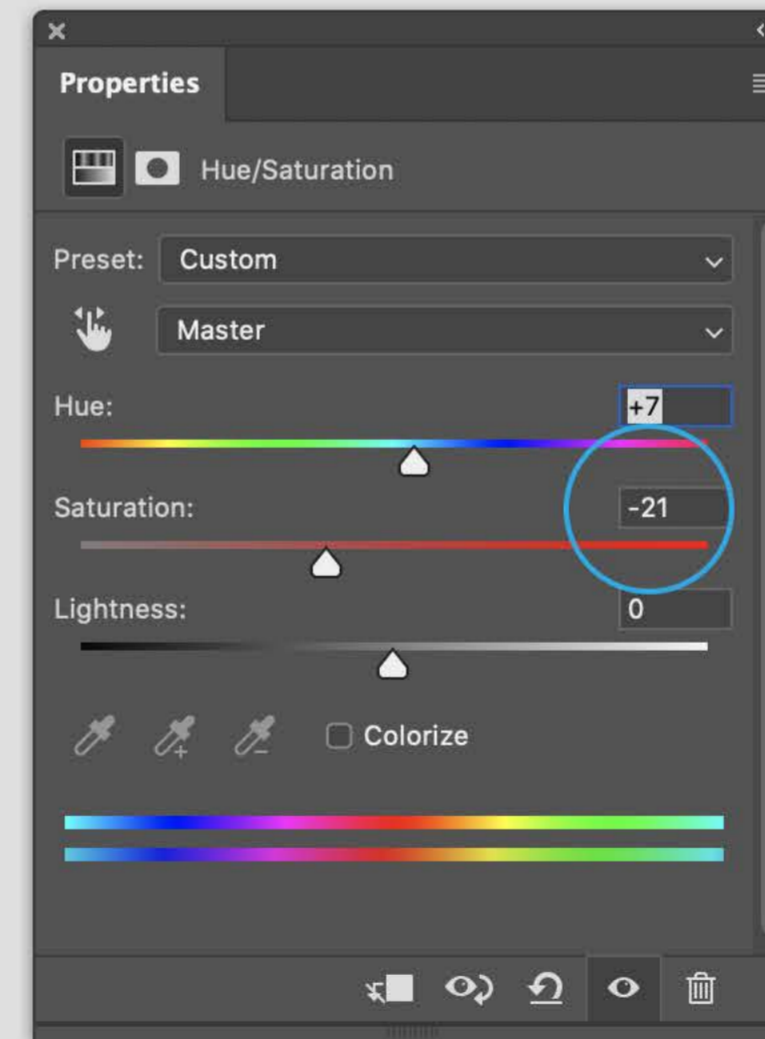
## Silver-toned effect

If an image lacks a silver tone and is overly saturated, adjustments that help approximate one in Photoshop include:

- Rich blacks
- Mid tones adjusted to the middle
- Highlights brought down to mid tones
- Some desaturation (quite a bit in some cases)



Use a "Levels" adjustment layer to make rich blacks and bring highlights to mid tones.



Use a "Hue/Saturation" adjustment layer to partially desaturate the image.
